The Competition Committee is pleased to share that judging of the STC Chicago Chapter 2010-2011 Technical Competition completed on Saturday, January 8, 2010. We received 27 entries this year with 12 judges volunteering to review the submissions. With STC International revising and changing many aspects of the competition, the judging teams traversed new territory and many entries with finesse!

STC International revised the submission categories this year to address the purpose of information presented - Informational, Instructional, Promotional, and User Support, rather than the previous focus on the media used to present the information. This change recognizes that it is not only how we present the information but more importantly, what we communicate. No longer are entries judged according to the delivery media but rather the quality of information. With the change, submitters are no longer constrained to submitting based on the media presentation but can submit entries that use the wide variety of technologies available today.

While the judging teams needed a little extra time to adapt to the new forms and evaluation strategies, once they got their feet wet, the judges agreed that the new approach was better both as a judge and for submitters. Forms were changed from a checklist format to a narrative evaluation. Submitters will benefit from a broad explanation of what is on target and what could be changed to improve the product.

The Competition Committee is also pleased to share that every submission entered this year was acknowledged with an award. Additionally, this year we will

path. I can honestly say that being a board member has enriched my experience in being an STC member.

Elizabeth Burke, the current STC Chicago Vice President and Competition Co-Chair, offers this advice:

If you have been in a leadership role before, this experience deals with a group where all are in your field and you get to shape the direction and perform long-term planning. If you haven't been in a leadership role before, this is an opportunity to experience leadership and receive mentoring, to avoid some mistakes, and to receive support when you inevitably make mistakes.

Depending on the role, the commitment can be open-ended or limited. Most elected positions are a year, but committee positions are flexible. Explore and do what works for you. The doors it opens can be subtle but have long-term benefits.

As I think about the past year, I think I'm most impressed by the credibility that volunteering gives. I've been in the profession a long time and received awards, but my role in STC as a chapter leader adds depth to the work I do and the role I have in the organization. I've discovered that the members who actively participate in volunteer activities are passionate about the profession and successful in their careers.

President's Message - Looking Back ... Did You Know...?

2011. When did that happen? For most of us, the beginning of a new year finds us taking a close look at the past year and making personal plans and goals for the new year. The same is true at STC Chicago. I have long understood the benefits and importance of being a member of a professional

international society such as STC. As I was putting together our application for the Community Achievement Award (CAA), I started to realize that as chapter officer for the past four years, and committee manager and committee member for several years before that, I often take for granted just how much we do as a community. I also began to wonder if our membership realizes what a strong community we have.

Did you know...

... ***We join forces!*** In August, STC Chicago joined forces with CISPI and CCASTD to host the third annual Chicago eLearning & Technology Showcase. Once again, the successful showcase earned the enthusiastic praise of attendees and presenters alike. Approximately 250 people took part in the showcase in 2010 (175 paid attendees, 30 speakers, 15 volunteers, and 30 vendors).

... ***We asked. You answered. We listened.*** In May, the Program Committee conducted a Chapter-wide survey regarding programs and workshops. The survey responses helped us design a 2010-11 program year that creates meaningful and valuable experiences for our professional community. In the survey, we sought suggestions for topics and locations, as well as formats. In addition, in response to your feedback, we have offered new programs in new venues and even in new formats.

... ***We have programs, workshops, and networking events for everyone!*** In 2010, we offered:

- Chapter Recognition Banquet (March)
- Writing for Global Markets (April)
- Full-day workshop conducted by Carole Berkson-Ross, a Talent Development Professional from California, "Technical Communicators Help Your Career Ride the Market Waves." (April)

- An "Introduction to Adobe Technical Communication Suite 2 and FrameMaker" workshop was presented by Betsy Maaks (May)
- Annual business meeting and networking event (June)
- Job Search Tips for Technical Communicators (August)
- Meet the New STC Competition: Everything all new and experienced entrants and judges need to know (September)
- Truth or Dare: Social Media (October)
- SharePoint and the Tech Comm Field (November)
- STC Chicago held its first Webinar during the workday lunch hour. Prof. Brian Still from Texas Tech University spoke about agile usability in his presentation, "Agile Usability: The Benefits of Iterative Testing." (December)

... ***We win awards!*** Our Chapter newsletter, *Byline*, has won an Apex award for the past five consecutive years. Our Chapter has won both Community of Excellence and Community of Distinction over the past four consecutive years.

... ***We hold Technical Communications Competitions!*** The Competition Committee (the Entries and Awards Manager, Judging Manager, and Sr. Review Panel) revamped our annual local competition to use the new purpose-based Summit Awards categories of Informational Materials, Instructional Materials, Marketing Materials, and User Support Materials.

... ***We judge science fairs!*** We have been invited and have proudly participated as judges in the Chicago Public Schools and the Chicago Non-Public Schools Science Fairs for the past *fifteen* years! In addition, our own Chris Hester was invited to be a mentor to the students this year as they prepare for the science fairs.

... ***We meet informally for lunch!*** Once a month, members and non-members alike have the opportunity to meet informally over lunch to discuss the world of technical communication (or other important things like our wonderful Chicago sports teams!). This happens during the lunch hour with our Thursdays @ STC Chicago program.

... ***We get around!*** In addition to our Website (stc-chicago.org), you can find our programs and events listed on a
