Subscribe and Save on 2008-2009 Program Meetings

STC Chicago is offering season passes to our events, with the convenience of one-time registration and a reduced cost per meeting. The new program year brings a few important changes:

- Pass prices are rolling back to the 2006-2007 rate of \$20 per meeting (except the awards banquet).
- Full and partial season passes are now a membersonly benefit, because STC has increased its support of chapters from member dues.
- Holders of season passes can send substitutes (or request refunds) for meetings they cannot attend by contacting STC Chicago a day or more in advance.
- Holders of passes qualify for discounts on selected workshops and other special events to be announced later.

We offer these passes for the 2008-2009 season:

- the Three-Meeting Pass for \$60 (includes three meetings with speakers)
- the Five-Meeting Pass for \$100 (includes all five meetings with speakers)
- the Seven-Meeting Pass for \$160 (includes the networking event in June 2009 and our annual awards banquet in March 2009)

Registration rates for individual meetings remain the same as in 2008-2009, starting at \$30 each for members who register online for meetings with speakers or for our networking event. In addition, members who register online can still register a guest at the member rate.

- 2. The fee is \$75 for each entry submitted before the deadline, \$100 for each entry submitted after the deadline.
- 3. The competition is open to members and nonmembers.
- Members and non-members are encouraged to judge – please contact Dan Dornbrook (<u>vicepresident@stc-chicago.org</u>) to volunteer as a judge.

New this year:

- Entries receiving Distinguished *or* Excellence are eligible for entry into the Society-level competitions.
- Entries in languages other than English may be accepted. Please check with the competition manager before submitting your entry to determine if judges are available for your entry.

- Art Competition: The number of categories has been reduced from 17 to 12.
- 8. Art Competition: Oversized entries (over 11x17 inches) must be rolled instead of mounted.
- Technical Publications Competition: The number of categories has been reduced from 15 to 6.
- 10. Technical Publications Competition: Please be careful to submit the required number of issues for newsletters, journals, and other periodicals. If issues are missing, an entry is disqualified.

Byline Wins Second Consecutive APEX Award

STC Chicago's award-winning newsletter, *Byline*, has received the APEX Award of Excellence for the second consecutive year.

The APEX awards program honors excellence in a multitude of professional communication areas, including newsletters, magazines, and Web and intranet design. Its Award of Excellence recognizes significant achievement in graphic design, editorial content, and overall communications effectiveness.

Editor Tom Lunde is responsible for managing this year's publication, and Francis Bao has served as the Advertising Manager. During Tom's four years as editor, *Byline* also received two awards of Merit and one award of Excellence in the STC International Newsletter Competition.

Tom and Francis attribute *Byline's* success in no small part to the help they receive from members of the chapter's Administrative Council and from chapter members who contribute their time and knowledge.

Tom sums up their award-winning approach by saying, "I came up with a layout and organization that I feel works well and we regularly try new ideas, such as

the Member Profile, that I feel benefits our members."

The benefits to STC Chicago members are considerable. As one of the largest chapters in the society, its members need a wide variety of information at any given time, from job-seeking tips to professional skills development. In the spirit of trying out new ideas, this year's newsletter introduced an expanded format that included member profiles, employment success stories, and volunteer spotlights.

Francis adds: "Byline effectively serves as the communication tool which helps those members to meet their professional needs. As a professional organization, we view Byline as a significant part of our success since it expands the vision of our members and makes them become successful technical communicators."

The newsletter's popularity and quality also stand out in an era where people increasingly get their information through electronic media rather than print pieces. Being a printed piece may be what gives it an edge over other formats.

Tom says, "I think *Byline* bridges the gap where Intercom and the STC journal [Technical Communication] stop in that it reports information vital to STC Chicago members. I also think that our decision to print and mail the newsletter helps out a lot. Printing and mailing Byline is certainly more expensive and time-consuming than emailing a PDF file or posting it on our Web site, but we know that not every STC Chicago member is on our email list. If we mail *Byline*, then we know that every one of our members gets a copy."
