#### President's Message - Fortunate Events

Signs tend to comfort me. If I make it through several green lights in a row, I like to believe something good is going to happen. And if my cable modem gets moody and stops working for a while, I figure I should take a break (so it's old, and I may be getting older, too, but hey, more coffee!). Superstition says 13 at the table is unlucky, but I saw 13 at the table recently. It was anything but an unfortunate event.

A few months ago, our Vice President, Linda Jansak, proposed *Thursdays at STC Chicago* as informal gettogethers for technical communicators who live and work throughout the metropolitan Chicago area. These events were designed to be open to all, with locations anywhere volunteers were willing to coordinate them, and discussion topics that could include anything. Her advice evolved to insight about my son (who recently turned 13), and I went home that day with some effective strategies for helping him organize his homework. I sat next to a former member who has published a book and whose uncle was a Nobel Prize winner – I learned many interesting things from her, including why she's no longer a member. At another event, we discussed potential program ideas for next year, and I

finally talked with a well-regarded chapter member with whom I've corresponded occasionally via e-mail but hadn't seen in years.

For those of you who are new to the chapter, I encourage you to meet up with a *Thursday* group and grab some food, even if it's just dessert, and get to know us. If you're a long-term member who has been taking a break from chapter activities for a while, use these events to get reacquainted with us. Remember, these are informal gatherings – the only cost is what you spend on your meal, and it is OK if you can't stay for the entire time – we scheduled "longer" lunches to be flexible with lunch schedules. Bring a co-worker, drop in if your plans change at the last minute, and if it looks like the table is full, pull up a chair anyway.

#### The Value of Volunteering - Candidates Sought for Chapter Offices

Serving your STC chapter, like most things done for a good cause, is not a financially lucrative undertaking. But the value that STC provides to you—to all of our members—depends upon the efforts of those who volunteer their time and talents.

This effort should not be thought of as entirely selfless, especially for newer members of the organization. Volunteering with STC Chicago lets you get an inside look at how your professional society really works. When you volunteer with STC Chicago, you will also better appreciate all of the effort that goes into keeping STC vibrant.

Each spring, STC Chicago elects (1) a slate of administrative council officers (AC) composed of President, Vice President, Treasurer, Secretary, and (2) a fourmember Nominating Committee. The STC administrative council is a governing board—setting goals and policies, planning activities to support those goals, budgeting, and coordinating the efforts of committees that contribute to the strength and well-being of the organization.

All Administrative Council members, except the immediate past president, are elected by the membership for one-year terms (even though the chapter vice president ascends to the president's position, the vice president must be listed on the ballot as the candidate for president per the chapter bylaws). Newer chapter members may consider the position of secretary to be an excellent introduction to serving on the AC and learning about its responsibilities. Treasurer is also a rewarding position for those who have some accounting or bookkeeping experience.

The Nominating Committee recruits candidates for the

chapter election and nominates members for STC honors. It is generally composed of a good mix of newer and more experienced members. Participation in the Nominating Committee will help you develop your personal and professional network and learn more about STC Chicago's membership and history (people who might have difficulty attending regular meetings may note that serving on this committee is not a large investment of time).

A key benefit that you derive from participating in chapter offices and other positions is mentoring, according to Russ Friend, a longtime STC member and past president of the Chicago Chapter. "I've found that serving in a chapter office is a great way to give something back to all the folks who helped me along the way," he notes, "teaching others some of the things that I've learned."

My own experience is that serving on the AC is an excellent introduction to board-style leadership—not just the nuts and bolts of meeting management and procedures but prioritizing goals and delegating responsibilities. As two-term secretary, I had the opportunity to work with some of the more experienced (and connected) members of the chapter, and learned much that was useful for my later participation in board of education governance and other community leadership roles. There's one other thing you'll learn from joining in what a great time you can have working with your peers. I found that what I had taken on with a grim sense of responsibility (after receiving "that call" from a Nominating Committee member) actually became one of the highlights of my month. It's a chance for serious business but also serious camaraderie-and developing the personal and professional relationships
