## In Memoriam: Andi Dunn

STC Chicago sadly notes the passing of our good friend and chapter member, Andi Dunn. After a seven-year battle with multiple cancers, she lost her battle on December 14, 2019.

Although she chose not to renew two years ago when her cancer returned, she had been a member of STC Chicago for 24 years. During that time, she served multiple roles:

- Program Manager
- Nominating Committee for two years
- Panelist speaker
- Competition Judge for multiple years

At the society level, she volunteered for the Independent Consultants SIG for three years.

Since 2001, Andi had owned her own technical communications consulting company, and had been in the technical communications field for her entire career.

She had been a patient peer volunteer at 1-to-1 Connection and had volunteered for the Greater Chicago Chapter HIMSS (Healthcare Information and Management Systems Society) - a nonprofit organization whose goal is to promote the best use of IT and management systems in the healthcare industry around the world.

When Andi entered hospice in late November, one of her many friends and colleagues came to us, with Andi's permission, asking to donate the funds for a Memorial Membership Grant in Andi's name. We thought this was a wonderful idea and the Chapter decided to match that, so we awarded two 2020 memberships in honor of Andi. The recipients were Alex Yant and Rachel Friend.

Alex is a young professional just breaking into the Tech Comm world and has been active in the Chapter this past year. You've probably seen his meeting review articles in the last couple of Byline newsletters. Rachel is also a young professional who currently serves as our Byline Editor. She has a background in graphic design and is the winner of our Design Contest the last two years. She returned to school in January and we have purchased a student membership for her for 2020.

Since Andi's passing, several friends have asked if they could donate as well. Since we have already awarded the two 2020 grants, we decided that we will collect any donations in Andi's name and next fall, we will award yet another Memorial Membership Grant for 2021. Please watch our website for the announcement of this grant with a donation link. In the event enough funds are not collected to fund a full membership, the Chapter will pay the difference.

A Celebration of Life party will be held on May 9 at her daughter, Hannah's house. Details to follow.


