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## September Webinar with Jack Molisani

After a summer hiatus, STC Chicago resumed its Wednesday Webinar series on September 28 with a presentation by Jack Molisani, titled “Hiring Booms and Mass Resignations and Pre-recession Layoffs, Oh My! How to Score Your Next Position in a Shifting Job Market”.

Jack is an STC Fellow and the president of ProSpring Technical Staffing, an employment agency specializing in content professionals, both contract and direct hire (see <https://ProspringStaffing.com>). He is also the author of *Be the Captain of Your Career: A New Approach to Career Planning and Advancement*, which hit #5 on Amazon’s Career and Resume Best Seller list.

“In the 25 years I’ve been a professional recruiter, I’ve seen hiring booms and mass layoffs as economies ebb and flow. However, I’ve never seen hiring booms, pre-recession layoffs, and mass resignations at the same time,” Jack said.

In his presentation, Jack noted that resignations per month have reached 3% of total U.S. employment, and while the unemployment rate for the general U.S. population is 3.7%, among technical professions it fell to 1.7% in July and is near the all-time low of 1.3% recorded in May 2019.

At the same time, many employers, out of fear of an upcoming recession, are reducing discretionary expenses, imposing pre-emptive layoffs, and pressing for a return to in-office work in ways that conflict with many employees’ expectations of increased flexibility in the wake of the global pandemic.

In light of this complex environment, Jack offered the following recommendations for anyone looking for a new job:

- When considering whether to work from home, in an office, or in hybrid mode, which is becoming the preferred mode, identify which mode works best for you and pursue opportunities that support that.
- Search for jobs online, wherever you can find listings, but apply through a personal referral whenever possible. (If you do not personally know someone at a target company, use

LinkedIn to identify their recruiters and approach them directly.)

- Be findable. Make sure your resume and online profiles show your experience, education, and work tools you have used so that potential employers know what you can do for them.
- When building your resume and online profiles, don’t sacrifice usability and readability for graphic design. Clear communication of your skills and experience to potential employers is the priority.

In addition to recruiting, Jack also produces the LavaCon Conference on Content Strategy and Technical Communication Management (see <https://LavaCon.org>). LavaCon is the first of two current Friends of STC Chicago sponsors of chapter events. Jack invited STC Chicago members and their colleagues to register for this year’s conference, scheduled for October 23-26 in New Orleans, using the referral code “CHISTC” for a \$200 discount on registration. Attendees shared their enthusiasm for in-person networking and exploring what is new in the field of eLearning. ## Competition Deadline is October 15

We're excited to get started on this year's STC Chicago Technical Communication Competition. This is our 51st competition, and we're looking for a lot of diverse entries this year. Will yours be one of them?

Although the name is "competition," each entry is evaluated on its own merit, evaluated against industry standards, and not judged against other entries. This is an opportunity to have other professional technical communicators evaluate your work and provide feedback. Receiving feedback is an important tool for any technical communicator at any level in their career. Receiving recognition for your work is even better and always goes a long way in proving to management teams the importance of what you do.

Now is the time to look at the work you've produced over the past year or so and decide what you are going to enter in the 2022 STC Chicago Technical Communication Competition. The categories for entries are:

- Training Materials
- Informational Materials
- Promotional Materials
- User Support Materials

STC Chicago is accepting entries August 15 through October 15, 2022. The competition entry fees are listed below and must be made online (companies submitting multiple entries can contact us to arrange payment by check).

- Full-Time Students: \$25
- STC Chicago Members: \$50
- Other STC Members: \$75
- Non-STC Members: \$100

### Who is eligible to enter?

Everyone, STC member or not, is eligible to submit entries to our competition. ### Improving Usability in Smartphone Apps: Leveraging Unstructured Feedback and User-Generated Content Can Improve the User's Experience

The rise and proliferation of Web 3.0 technologies has enabled these kinds of interactions, allowing users to benefit from the experiences of other users. As technical communicators, we can also leverage the UGC created through such exchanges to better understand the needs of our audiences in a range of digital contexts.

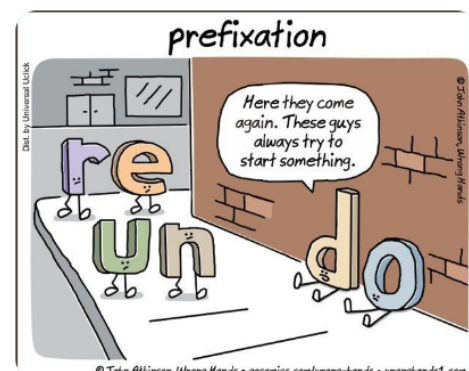
In this session, we focus on how UGC can be used to improve smartphone apps. Using a study on a mobile health app that we conducted, we briefly address two inter-related questions:

- How might UGC be leveraged to improve the usability of apps?
- And how can users be prompted to provide valuable UGC feedback?
